

Historical Route

1 day: Split

Sightseeing of Split – more than 1700 years old town, inscribed on the UNESCO World Heritage List. Visit to the city historic monuments: Cathedral of Saint Dujam, Diocletian's Palace, Peristil, Vestibul etc.

2 day: Hvar - Devil Islands

Sunbathing and sightseeing of the Island Hvar. Visit to the archipelago Devil Islands with the beautiful Island Palmižana. Staying overnight in Hvar, town famous for one of the most ancient city theaters in the world.

3 day: Vis

Sightseeing of the Island Vis which was the Yugoslav fortress in the communist era, forbidden for foreign tourists. Like a pearl in the shell, Vis has recently opened up to the rest of the world and is today one of the most visited destinations on the Adriatic. Visit to the Blue Cave, a natural phenomenon on the Island Biševo.

4 day: Korčula

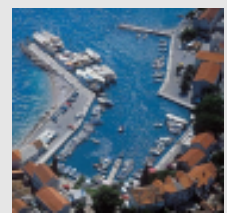
Sightseeing of the Island Korčula, former Greek colony. The island's name derives from the Greek *Corkyra Melaine* – Black Korčula indicating the dark colour of the island, overgrown with pines and cypress trees. Even today Korčula is one of the greenest islands in Croatia. Visit to the town Korčula – birth city of Marco Polo, the most famous world traveler.

5 day: Hvar

Cruising to Hvar and staying overnight in Starigrad - the oldest city on Croatian islands and the former Greek colony. Hvar has the largest number of sunny hours in the whole Mediterranean and it is famous for the Plavac Mali sort of wine.

Visiting the Island Brač, a famous paradise for windsurfing, jet skiing and other water sports. Sunbathing on Golden Cape, the most beautiful beach on the Adriatic, surrounded by high mountains which create spectacular scenery.

7 day: Trogir

Visit to Trogir, remarkable city under UNESCO protection, with the most beautiful cathedral in this part of Europe and ancient fortress in the town Riva.
